First Cycle Undergraduate Major Program

Establishment

Munzur University Faculty of Health Sciences was established with the decision of the Council of Ministers numbered 2010/367 published in the Official Gazette dated 28.04.2010 and numbered 27565.

Qualification Awarded

This department is subject to the undergraduate degree system of 240 ECTS credits in the field of Nursing in higher education. When the program is successfully completed and the program qualifications are provided, a Bachelor's degree in Nursing is obtained.

Admission and Registration Requirements

Candidates must have a high school diploma or equivalent school diploma and must have enough points from the YKS Numerical score type from the University Student Selection Examination.

Rules for Recognition of Prior Learning (Formal, In-Formal, Non-Formal) The provisions of the

"Regulation on the Principles of Transferring Between Associate Degree and Undergraduate Programs, Double Major, Minor and Inter-Institutional Credit Transfer in Higher Education Institutions" are applied.

Qualification Requirements and Rules

Students must first take the failed course(s) each semester. Internal Medicine Nursing and Surgical Diseases Nursing courses cannot be taken before the Fundamentals of Nursing course is successful. In order to obtain a bachelor's degree in nursing, students must successfully complete all of the compulsory and elective courses (240 ECTS credits in total) and have a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 out of 4.00. Students with a GPA of 2.00 and above are considered successful except for the courses they receive FF.

Profile of the Programme

The aim of the Nursing Program is to train nurses who are trained with approaches and methods based on science and technology; who can effectively perform their care, education, research, management, consultancy and leadership roles within the framework of scientific principles in protecting, developing and maintaining the health of the individual, family and society, and who are also sensitive to social problems and have developed critical thinking skills.

Occupational Profiles of Graduates with Examples

Graduates who successfully complete their undergraduate education can work as nurse, education nurse, special branch nurse, consultant, manager nurse, instructor in higher education institutions that provide nursing education, in institutions and organizations belonging to public and private sectors, workplaces, schools, mother and child health centers, care and education centers established for special groups (disabled and elderly), institutions providing home care services in our country and abroad in the fields of preventive, curative, rehabilitative health services for individuals who have disability and loss of workforce; They can work as nurses, training nurses, special branch nurses, consultants, executive nurses, instructors in higher education institutions providing nursing education.

Access to Further Studies

Candidates who have successfully completed their undergraduate education can apply to the relevant departments of the Schools of Health, Faculties of Health Sciences within the quotas and study in Master's or Doctorate programs.

Exams, Measurement and Evaluation

The contribution of the midterm exam (scores obtained from measurement tools such as homework, laboratory exams, quizzes, etc. can also be evaluated as midterm grades) to the success grade is 40% and the contribution of the final exam is 60%. All exams are evaluated out of 100 points. It is compulsory to get at least 50 points from the final exam. Students who receive one of the letter grades AA, BA, BB, CB and CC from a course are considered to have succeeded in that course. DC and DD grades are conditionally successful grades. In order for a student to be successful in a course with a DC or DD grade, his/her overall weighted grade point average must be at least 2.0. If the student's GPA is lower than 1.80, he/she must repeat the courses he/she has taken until he/she raises his/her GPA to the specified level. The

semesters in which the student repeats the courses are included in the calculation of the maximum education period.

Graduation Requirements

In order to successfully complete the program, it is necessary to pass all of the courses and applications (240 ECTS credits) available in the program, to obtain a GPA of at least 2.0 out of 4.00 and to successfully complete the professional internships.

Opportunities of the Department

With four years of education in the nursing program, information is provided on basic subjects and applications in the first year, and in the second, third and fourth years; Thanks to the compulsory and elective courses for the profession, the student is provided with practical training in the sector where the student aims to work. The applications of the courses are carried out in full-fledged hospitals, primary community health centers, family health centers.

Program Outcomes

10. Responsibility to participate in local, national and international trainings for the institution after graduation and to support the employees under his/her management
11. Responsibility to adhere to nursing values and ethical principles
12. Ability to communicate effectively with the individuals and team members he/she cares for by sharing his/her ideas verbally and in writing
13. Ability to organize project activities for the social, cultural, economic and ecological environment in which he/she lives with a sense of social responsibility
